

PASANG





BACKGROUND

The Pasang or otherwise Indonesian checkers is a very original game.

It is the only one from game in which the pieces are used in the same manner from different players, which may be 2,3,4 or more!

MATERIALS

A square board with 112 holes-dents, 56 blue marbles, 56 white (we can also design simply squares and play with flat pawns, so that the construction is even easier).

Object of the game: The top score

PROGRESS OF THE GAMES

Initially the players place the balls. The easy way is their alteration depending on their color. The players follow turns in a clockwise direction.

The player who plays first gets a ball off the four corners of the board and the game starts.

Each time, in order to get a ball, we have to go over it with another ball lying in an adjacent hole, providing that the point at which will land is empty.

The movements are performed horizontally or vertically.

To get the balls that are in diagonal arrangement you should move diagonally.

We can obtain more than one balls, using the same attacking ball and when the number of the collected balls is odd.

The balls we gain get out of the game and at the end shall be counted by each player.

Marks and score:

When all the balls get out of the game, each player counts his score:

- 1 white ball corresponds to a single point
- 1 black ball corresponds to 2 points

Winner is the player who has the highest score
